Non Violent Parole Review Process Board of Parole Hearings Correspondence – NV P.O. Box 4036 Sacramento, CA 95812-4036

Re: Atiles, Tina Marie CDCR No. WG8356 Court Docket No. 20FE008595

Inmate Atiles is a well-established violent felon and should not be paroled. The circumstances surrounding her current conviction and prior criminal record show she poses an unreasonable risk of violence to the community.

On May 29th, 2020, officers observed Inmate Atiles driving a Ford F-250. A records check of that vehicle revealed it had been reported stolen. A traffic stop was initiated. Inmate Atiles stated that she purchased the vehicle from a man named "Leroy" a few hours before being contacted and that she paid \$850 for it. Inmate Atiles denied knowing the vehicle was stolen, yet used a screwdriver to drive the vehicle because "Leroy" lost the keys. Law enforcement spoke to the owner of the vehicle **material** who indicated that the vehicle was stolen on May 22nd, 2020. **Material** estimated the value to be in the range of \$5,000 to \$10,000. Inmate Atiles was arrested and during the booking process, officers found five individual plastic bags containing approximately 2.6 grams of suspected methamphetamine. Total weight of the drugs was approximately 13 grams.

Inmate Atiles' previous convictions and prior prison experience did nothing to change her violent and otherwise criminal behavior. Inmate Atiles has a long and violent criminal history consisting of multiple prison commitments for thefts, vehicle thefts, and drugs.

In 1988 Inmate Atiles was convicted of a misdemeanor PC 12020, possession of weapon. In 1990, she was convicted of the same offense, but this time as a felony. In 1993, Inmate Atiles was convicted of a misdemeanor DUI and drug offense. In 1994 she was

convicted of misdemeanor PC 476. In 1998 she was convicted of felony drugs. In 1999, she was convicted of two misdemeanor drugs. In 2002 she was convicted of PC 3056, parole revocation, a felony VC 10851, vehicle theft, and a felony PC 487(a) grand theft. In 2005, she was convicted of PC 3056, another parole revocation. In 2005, Inmate Atiles was convicted of her strike offense, a felony PC 459, burglary in the first degree. In 2009, she was convicted of a felony PC 32. In 2012, she was convicted of a felony VC 20001, hit and run. In 2016 she was convicted of a misdemeanor PC 242 and 594 battery and vandalism. In 2018, she was convicted of a felony vandalism. In 2022, she was convicted of another felony VC 10851, a vehicle theft. Inmate Atiles has only served 15 months of her four-year prison sentence and should serve the remainder of it in custody.

As we are given 30 days to respond, and we are not provided with any recent disciplinary history or any other information aside from the one-page notice of parole review, I cannot comment on Inmate Atiles' prison conduct. However, from the record that is available it is clear that Inmate Atiles should not be released as she poses a significant, unreasonable risk of violence to the community. Parole should be denied.
