Re: Truong, Timmy CDCR No. BT2211 Court Docket No. 22FE007509

Inmate Truong is an established violent felon and should not be paroled. The circumstances surrounding his current conviction and prior criminal record show he poses an unreasonable risk of violence to the community.

On April 08, 2022, Inmate Timmy Truong and another co-defendant entered the home of victim in Sacramento, California. They broke in through the back door, and stole a safe from bedroom closet containing the second stole silver coins located in a different bedroom of the second bedroom of the bedroom of the truong by connecting this burglary with a separate residential burglary Inmate Truong committed in Milpitas, California two days later. On May 04, 2022, Inmate Truong burglarized another residence, this time in Folsom, California. The rear door of the residence was broken into via tool, breaking the deadbolt and doorknob. Inmate Truong ransacked the master bedroom of the residence, taking \$8,000 in U.S. currency. Detective follow-up eventually connected Inmate Truong to four additional separate residential burglaries in Sacramento County occurring in 2022. Inmate Truong was originally charged with six residential burglaries, and ultimately pled No Contest to the two above-referenced burglaries on April 08, 2022 and May 04, 2022.

While the offense of residential burglary is not classified as a "violent" felony in the California Penal Code, the volatile and violent confrontations that arise from this offense present a grave danger to the public. Inmate Truong's repeated commission of this crime highlights his disregard for public safety, and his prior convictions have not changed this behavior.

In 2014, Inmate Truong was convicted of bringing controlled substances and a cell

phone into a prison. In 2015, he was convicted of felony possession of methamphetamine for sale. In 2021, Inmate Truong was again convicted of residential burglary.

As we are given 30 days to respond, and we are not provided with any recent disciplinary history or any other information aside from the one-page notice of parole review, I cannot comment on Inmate Truong's prison conduct. However, from the record that is available it is clear that Inmate Truong should not be released as he poses a significant, unreasonable risk of violence to the community. Parole should be denied.
