Re: Damon Petree CDCR- BY4644, Docket No. 23FE011777

Inmate Petree is a threat to public safety. This is not only his third prison sentence since 2019, but it is a sentence that resulted from a strike conviction. Inmate Petree has repeatedly returned to custody after release and committed offenses that are increasing in seriousness. The circumstances surrounding his criminal history show that he poses an unreasonable risk to the community.

Inmate Petree's criminal history dates back to 2016 in Alaska where he suffered convictions for theft and forgery. Just two years later, in 2018, he suffered convictions for drug possession, identity theft, and a felony second-degree burglary. In 2019, Inmate Petree suffered felony convictions for second-degree burglary and vehicle theft. As a result of his convictions, Inmate Petree was sentenced to serve his first prison term of eight months. Upon his release on parole, Inmate Petree illegally possessed a firearm and was sentenced to serve his second prison sentence of 16 months. While on his second term of parole, Inmate Petree committed the current strike offense and was returned to prison for a 16-month term. During the commitment offense, Inmate Petree and an accomplice broke into an inhabited home and stole over \$10,000 worth of property from the victim.

Inmate Petree fails to comply with societal norms. He has a history of theft, illegal firearm possession and is now a serious offender who has a strike offense on his record. In the interest of justice and public safety, the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office opposes his premature parole.

As we are given 30 days to respond, and we are not provided with any disciplinary history or any other information aside from the one-page notice of parole review, I cannot comment on inmate Petree's prison conduct. However, from the record that is available it is clear that inmate Petree should not be released as he poses a significant, unreasonable risk of violence to the community. Parole should be denied.
