**Re: Eladio Gonzalez Garcia CDC # AS8565 Court Docket: 17FE017233**

Inmate Garcia is a well-established violent felon, and should not be paroled. The circumstances surrounding his current conviction and his prior criminal record show that he poses an unreasonable risk of violence to the community.

The Inmate is currently in prison for his 6<sup>th</sup> DUI [REDACTED]. During this incident the Inmate was driving at a .18 blood alcohol level with a child passenger. When he committed this DUI he was on parole for his prior DUI in which he served a five year state prison sentence. From the Inmate's criminal history, it is clear that he does not just have a drinking and driving problem. Rather, he has an abiding the law problem and violence problem. The Inmate has seven convictions for domestic violence or some sort of assault. Most notable is his prior strike conviction for criminal threats. During that incident, the Inmate had an abusive relationship with his ex-girlfriend who he had physically abused many times before. He showed up at her house, pounding on her door yelling "I'm going to get you [REDACTED]." She was in fear for her life and had to hide in her apartment until the Officers responded.

[REDACTED] In 1996, he began his [REDACTED] criminal life with a felony statutory rape conviction. Overall, he has 25 convictions with 6 parole violations. He continues to re-offend and re-victimize. While the Inmate can choose to live in denial about his problem with driving under the influence, the public simply does not have that luxury. It is an innocent citizen who is going to be his next victim when he kills somebody while driving under the influence.

As we are given 30 days to respond, and we are not provided with any disciplinary history or any other information aside from the one page notice of parole review, I cannot comment on Inmate Garcia's prison conduct. However, from the record that is available it is clear that Inmate Garcia should not be released as he poses a significant, unreasonable risk of violence to the community. Parole should be denied.
