Inmate Carter has been engaged in an uninterrupted life of crime felony convictions, one of which is for a violent strike: Robbery in violation of Penal Code § 211. He was on probation for that robbery and parole for vehicle theft when he committed the current vehicle theft. He had been released from jail on his robbery conviction less than 2 months before he committed the instant offense.

Attached are probation reports for his 2015 robbery as well as for a vehicle theft for which he was committed to State Prison in 2007.

This is Inmate Carter's 6<sup>th</sup> prison commitment. It does not appear he has ever successfully completed a period of probation or parole without committing a new felony offense. There is nothing particularly remarkable about the current commitment offense. Once again, he stole a vehicle and was arrested shortly thereafter with an unused syringe in his pocket. He knew he would return to prison and yet that fact did not prevent him from re-offending. At this point, all we as a society can do is to lock him up for as long as possible in order to delay his return to crime.
