Aging is not easy in our youth dominated culture and a sense of mortality and vulnerability is heightened when the sanctity of one's home is invaded. Inmate Moore has capped his career criminal rap sheet with his current second strike sentence: residential burglary of a home that was occupied by a 73 year-old woman. Inmate Moore cut a screen, entered her home and stole her purse and contents, including her cell phone. Fortunately, officers were quickly able to track her iPhone and found that Inmate Moore had tried to dispose of it in his toilet tank. For this offense, inmate Moore was allowed to plead to the residential burglary and admit a prior strike for 4 years in State Prison. When the plea was negotiated, it was anticipated by both sides that he would have to serve 80% of that time before being loosed on society.

Inmate Moore's first strike offense was a robbery which he committed in 2002. That offense occurred in Yolo County and the reports detailing the facts of that offense were purged. Sandwiched between these two strikes are a rich and varying array of other offenses and convictions including vehicle thefts, felony evading, drugs, vehicle burglaries and possession of stolen property. He has never successfully reintegrated into free society.

Since he is only in his mid-thirties, Inmate Moore still has many vigorous years in which to practice his occupation: a thief by any means available. He will enter our homes, steal our property by force or fear, or burglarize our cars. He cares not as long as he can obtain property for which he has not worked and to which he is not entitled. The District Attorney of Sacramento urges you to give the citizens of Sacramento a break and mandate that Inmate [REDACTED] serve the full sentence which he earned and so richly deserves.
