Inmate Holloway is a jack-of-all-trades-and-master-of-none. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] His first felony conviction was 5 years later in Oakland for grand theft. His strike offense of terrorist threats occurred in 1998.

By 2001 it appears Mr. Holloway decided he needed a trade so he turned to transporting methamphetamine.

By 2009 Mr. Holloway began his love affair with alcohol when he picked up his first DUI conviction. In 2010 he committed his second DUI and while still on probation for that, he picked up his third DUI, and this time he injured someone in another car. While still on probation for that felony DUI, he picked up his current DUI offense in 2014 and was sentenced to 32 months in prison, in the hopes that he will dry out, attend AA/NA and get a grip on his compulsion before he's once again released back onto our streets.

While I have not had an opportunity to review his C file, I trust the Board will do so to determine if he's mastered the recipe for pruno while in CDCR. If he's been able to steer clear of prison made alcohol, that will be one factor in his favor.

Alcohol will be plentiful upon his release. The District Attorney of Sacramento requests that Inmate Holloway serve his full-term to impress upon him the seriousness of the threat he poses and to protect our streets from him for a bit longer.
