Thank you for this opportunity to address the Board regarding the Board's administrative review of Inmate Martin Edmund Jeffries, P10846, and his suitability for early release.

In 1992, Inmate Jeffries was convicted Involuntary Manslaughter (PC192(b)) and sentenced to 365 days County Jail. In 1998, Inmate Jeffries was convicted of Attempted Robbery (PC664/211), and sentenced to 2 years State Prison (SP). In 2001, Jeffries was convicted of Residential Burglary (PC459) and sentenced to 9 years SP. In 2011, Inmate Jeffries was convicted of Residential Burglary (PC459) and sentenced to 9 years SP. In the 2011 Burglary, the victim was in the residence at the time of the Burglary.

In addition to his felony record, Inmate Jeffries has eight misdemeanor convictions between 1987 and 1993 for Welfare Fraud (WI 11483), Trespassing (PC 602), Obstructing an Officer (PC148), Possession of Stolen Property (PC 496), Theft (PC 484), Grand Theft (PC487.1), Theft with Priors (PC666), and Possession of Burglary Tools (PC 466).

There is nothing in Jeffries' history to suggest that he will not return to his criminal endeavors at the earliest opportunity, should he be released early from his current sentence. Given Inmate Jeffries' criminal career, one that includes serious and violent felonies, his previous failures on parole, and the fact that he has three prior strike offenses, the Sacramento District Attorney's Office requests that this Board find that Inmate Jeffries is not an appropriate candidate for parole at this early date.
