
"I am very fearful for my life and my children's safety. Will he be away for a long time?" These were the words of [REDACTED] after Inmate Miller left her bleeding. Unfortunately, this was not enough for Inmate Miller. He continued to threaten [REDACTED]'s life, while she was holding on to her one year old.

On November 3, 2014, Officers responded to the Inmate Miller's residence in regards to a domestic violence disturbance involving a gun. Officers contacted [REDACTED] and told them she and Defendant were in an argument when out of nowhere, Inmate Miller punched her in the face. It happened so suddenly [REDACTED] was unable to state how many times she was hit or with what hand. Officers observed bleeding from [REDACTED]'s lips. It's important to note that [REDACTED]'s one year old child, [REDACTED], was home on the day of the offense. After being assaulted [REDACTED] attempted to leave the situation with [REDACTED] and while she was holding him, Inmate Miller decided to strike again. While [REDACTED] was holding [REDACTED], Inmate Miller wrapped his hands around her throat and said "I will shoot you bitch!" This was not an empty threat. Officers found a loaded Browning 9mm handgun in the residence along with methamphetamine and marijuana. During a subsequent search of Inmate Miller, Officers located a 9mm bullet that matched the handgun found in the residence.

The acts committed by Inmate Miller on November 3, 2014 were both serious, and placed the safety of [REDACTED] and risk. However, this is not the first time Inmate Miller has placed the community at risk. In 1987, Inmate Miller was convicted of Robbery. Additionally, in 2011, Broderick was arrested for being a felon in possession of a firearm and was arrested in 2010 for possession of methamphetamine for sale. Both of these cases were still pending and Defendant was out of custody on bond when he assaulted and threatened [REDACTED].

The Inmate has proven time and time again that he is a danger to society. He deserves to serve his complete sentence. His criminal history, as well as the charges for which he has recently been convicted warrant such a finding.
