Re: Brian Stockton, #AX2475

██████████ was 29 years old when he was shot by his friend, Inmate Stockton. He was shot in his stomach and only survived thanks to the life-saving efforts of medical personnel. What separates this shooting from other shootings is the fact that ██████████ and Brian Stockton were friends. They lived across the street from each other and socialized together. So what could possibly provoke a friend to shoot another friend? In this case, ██████████ forgot his wallet at Brian Stockton's house and returned to pick it up.

It was this shooting in 1998 that showed the character of Brian Stockton. He is violent, impulsive, and dangerous; precisely the kind of person that should not benefit from an early release. He is exactly where he belongs.

In September of 2014, Brian Stockton again acted in accordance with his character. He was caught with \$250,000 worth of stolen audio and video equipment. This equipment was stolen from a church in Folsom, California. Along with the stolen goods, Brian Stockton was in possession of a handgun, two rifles, and hundreds of rounds of ammunition. Someone who has demonstrated their inability to handle the privilege of owning a firearm should not be in possession of three firearms and that many rounds of ammunition. For this crime, Brian Stockton received a four year prison sentence. He should be required to spend every one of those days behind bars.

In light of his violent history, his blatant disregard for the prohibition on him having firearms, and his impulsive character the People are adamantly opposed to any early release of Brian Stockton.
