On March 11, 2013, Inmate Whitney [REDACTED] committing a residential burglary. He broke into his victim's home through a bedroom window and stole their property. Latents were lifted from the scene and Inmate Whitney was identified as the burglar through those fingerprints. [REDACTED]

On April 11, 2013, officers were doing fare check on Lite Rail in Sacramento. The inmate did not have a ticket and appeared nervous so the officer checked him for weapons. Concealed in his waistband, the officer found a semi-automatic Starr 9 mm handgun with 6 bullets in the magazine, one in the chamber, the hammer cocked and the safety on. He was convicted of being a felony in possession of a handgun and is also currently serving this sentence.

Inmate Whitney has proven that he has no compunction about breaking into people's homes to steal their property, punching their grandfathers to steal his wallet and riding Lite Rail with a loaded, concealed cocked 9 mm handgun, ready to fire at a moment's notice. He is telling us in the only way he knows how that he's dangerous and he's ready to use whatever force and weapon is necessary to achieve his criminal ends. Our streets and bedrooms and elders are safer for every minute he spends locked up.

The District Attorney of Sacramento County urges the Board to deny Inmate Whitney an early release.
