


#iSMART

Youth Outreach Programs

BEFORE THE IMPACT

Speed is the #1 killer of teen drivers and passengers. Before the Impact is a nationally recognized driving safety program presented by the District Attorney's Office and Elk Grove Police Department.

This program educates teens and adults about safe driving choices and the consequences of poor decisions. Local examples of driving-related teen fatalities are featured, using personal stories, graphic video, and the actual wrecked car of a boy who died as a result of a crash.



GIFT

Gun Violence Information For Teens

GIFT educates teens about the legal consequences of gun possession and gun related violence, encouraging them to make positive choices. The GIFT team goes into the Youth Detention Facility, middle school, and high school classrooms to educate students on the legal and emotional consequences of gun use resulting in violence.

LUTHER BURBANK YOUTH ACADEMY

The Luther Burbank High School Youth Academy increases understanding and improves relations between youth and members of the criminal justice system. The program works to deter criminal activity among at-risk students; provides an overview of the criminal justice system including the roles and challenges of law enforcement, attorneys, and the courts; and inspires students to choose a career in the criminal justice system.

PACT

Partners Against Chronic Truancy

PACT helps parents of chronic truants recognize they must get their children to school and why regular school attendance is important. Parents are provided resources, including counseling services, mentoring programs, parenting classes, and access to school nurses.

REAL DUI COURT IN SCHOOLS

In an effort to educate and prevent students from driving under the influence, actual DUI court proceedings are brought to local high school campuses.

Sentencing hearings are conducted in front of high school students with a judge, prosecutor, defendant, and defense counsel. The hearing is followed by a discussion with guest speakers.



New Programs

YOUTH SHADOW DAY

High school students have an opportunity to get a first-hand look at the criminal justice process by shadowing prosecutors, defense attorneys, criminal investigators, probation officers, judges, and crime lab staff. The goal of the program is to educate and enlighten youth about the criminal justice system.



YOUTH ACADEMY

High school students are invited to actively learn about the criminal justice system, hear from our criminal justice partners, and engage in open communication between law enforcement and themselves concerning issues that affect youth today. The program also encourages youth to consider a career in the justice system. The Academy is offered in both the north and south Sacramento areas.
