It is hard to believe that on this day, Adam has been gone for two years..... There is still no confirmation of a trial start date. The May 23rd hearing was a mix up of miscommunication between the three Attorneys, leaving the Judge with only the month of August to consider, and I have been told that the DA did not expect this continuation, and is making an effort to move the trial date to June. I no longer react with anger or disbelief, two years of hearings have now trained me to conform to the process of a legal system that moves at it's own, deliberate pace. I have learned where to park near the jailhouse, how to dress unadorned for the metal detector, find the correct courtroom down the long hallway on the first floor, and scan the case docket to confirm the date and time. I know where to sit in the courtroom for the best view of the inmate cage, the Judge, the roaming Attorneys and the somber Baliffs. I have been trained......but I do not know how to trust in a system of justice.....

I woke up this morning unsure how the day would feel, but I got up early, dressed for a long work day, fed the dogs, gathered the patient files for six therapy sessions, placed a small vase of flowers and photo on the front seat of my car, and headed out. I was driving to the site of Adams death, a place I no longer frequent, after I took the cross home when it had been set on fire a few months ago. As I neared the location, I could see how disfigured the hard ground had become where the cross had stood. The dirt holes were deeper and larger, the surface was grossly uneven and littered with rocks, and I was unable to park in my usual spot alongside the once tidy flower bed.

I parked closer to the adjacent street, watched the traffic as I exited the car, and walked around to the passenger side to retrieve the flowers and photo of Adam. I placed them on the ground directly in front of the spot where the cross had stood, paused for a while to remember my two years here, and a homeless man rode up on his bike and stopped. I smiled and stuck out my hand to shake his with affection, as he and his girlfriend had camped in the dense trees for the last two years, and had watched diligently over the cross and garden, keeping it free of debris.

His wide grin was infectious, as he told me that he and his girlfriend would be moving into a small house next weekend, after four years of living on the streets. He couldn't stop gushing about how lucky he felt, how he never imagined this could truly be offered as an option to leave the streets and ground behind. We held hands briefly for the last time, and then we departed our separate ways.

For the rest of the day, I felt peaceful, calm, and so grateful for the love and warmth that poured in from friends via text and email. I drove home tonight, profoundly aware that anguish and despair did not find me today, did not even creep up close unexpectedly. Time has rebuilt some healing, softened the fury and is nudging me to believe in a life with joy again.....still a progressive journey, but no longer so dark.
