Inmate Steven Jaco, has not served enough time for his conviction and should not be paroled. The circumstances surrounding his current conviction and his prior criminal record show that he will continue to victimize the community if given a break and released from custody early.

On February 21, 2019, inmate Jaco was observed by law enforcement driving a stolen vehicle with stolen plates. Jaco and his girlfriend gave inconsistent statements on how the vehicle came into their possession. Inmate Jaco had just been released from jail on February 9, 2019 after serving 270 days for a possession of a stolen motorcycle.

[REDACTED] When he was 19 years old Inmate Jaco was sentenced to a year in the county jail for robbery. Jaco put a 13-year-old boy in a chokehold and took \$249 from him. He then took \$25 from a 14-year-old boy.

As we are given 30 days to respond, and we are not provided with any disciplinary history or any other information aside from the one-page notice of parole review, I cannot comment on inmate Jaco's prison conduct. However, from the record that is available it is clear that inmate Jaco should not be released as he has not served the sentenced that justice requires. Parole should be denied.
