Re: Seuthsanith, Steven CDCR No. BK0367 Court Docket No. 19FE011081

Inmate Seuthsanith has established himself as a dangerous gang member and a serious felon and should not be paroled. The circumstances surrounding his current conviction and his prior criminal record show that he poses an unreasonable risk of danger to the community.

On June 20, 2019, officers checking on a suspicious vehicle contacted inmate Seuthsanith who was in the driver's seat. He gave the officers a fake name, but they quickly discovered his true identity and that he was not only on post-release community supervision (PRCS) but that he also had a no bail warrant for his arrest. During the search of his vehicle, officers located a loaded firearm with the serial number scratched off under his seat, fake money, a mask, gloves, and a bandana. Inmate Seuthsanith who is a validated Tiny Rascal Gang (TRG) gang member, had numerous items of gang indicia on his person.



Moreover, inmate Seuthansith has already shown this board how he will repay any grant of leniency – by violating the law and failing to comply with the terms of his release. As his criminal history shows, he is unable to follow the rules or law once released from prison custody – picking up at least two parole violations, two separate felony convictions, and one misdemeanor conviction – while out in the community. Clearly, his inability to live a crime-free life for any appreciable period of time demonstrates his lack of suitability for early release.

As we are given 30 days to respond, and we are not provided with any disciplinary history or any other information aside from the one-page notice of parole review, I cannot comment on inmate Seuthsanith's prison conduct. However, from the record that is available it is clear that inmate Seuthansith should not be released as he poses a significant, unreasonable risk of violence to the community. Parole should be denied.
